This project, funded in the framework of the LLP – Grundtvig programme (adult education), is focused on the professionals who work with /take care of people with severe intellectual disabilities, defined as people "who need treatment and permanent support in their daily life and do not possess the basic competencies necessary to manage autonomously their personal relationships".
